Vaccine Availability Expands: 3.19.21 Update

Dear Patient:

We want to share some good news regarding vaccine eligibility. Today, March 19th, eligibility for COVID-19 vaccination in Connecticut has been expanded to include individuals age 45 and older. Eligibility for those with pre-existing conditions will soon be announced. Additionally, projections are that vaccines will be available to all Connecticut residents age 16 and over by April 5th.

For state of New York residents

Eligible individuals include:

--Ages 60 and older

--Frontline workers

- Public-facing government and public employees
- Not-for-profit workers who provide public-facing services to New Yorkers
- Essential in-person public-facing building service workers

--Those with underlying medical conditions, including:

- Cancer (prior or current)
- Chronic kidney or liver disease
- Pulmonary disease (COPD, mod/severe asthma, Cystic Fibrosis, pulmonary fibrosis, and other pulmonary disease related to 9/11 attacks)
- Heart Conditions (heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies, and hypertension)
- Immunocompromised patients (organ/blood/bone marrow transplant recipients, immune deficiencies, HIV, use of corticosteroid medications)
- Obesity—BMI (Body Mass Index) greater than 30
- Pregnancy

- Sickle cell anemia or thalassemia
- Diabetes
- Cerebrovascular disease
- Neurologic conditions
- Intellectual and developmental disabilities
